The SEBD Outreach Service (SEBDOS) is a traded service which provides schools with the support, advice and training to enable them to meet the needs of pupils with social, emotional and mental health difficulties.

SEBDOS includes high quality and experienced practitioners from a range of professional backgrounds. Individual staff members have specific expertise in working with early years and primary and secondary aged pupils with social, emotional and mental health difficulties.

They work with pupils in both mainstream schools and specialist provisions either individually, part of a small group or whole classes. The team offers bespoke advice and consultation to school staff. It also offers support and training for teachers and teaching assistants around managing social, emotional and mental health difficulties.
